OUR GOAL

Identification of the new HIV positives from the general population and to put them on a life saving therapy and other services.

OBJECTIVES

- To offer HIV testing services to both key and general populations
- To identify HIV new positives from partner notification services (PNS)
- To give comprehensive policy guidelines for the quality HIV testing services in Kenya

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE REPORT

Outlines all the HIV testing services offered in St. Camillus mission hospital within a period of one year

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Kenya has an average HIV prevalence rate of 6% as compared to 1985 when it was reported to be at 59 %, (HIV/AIDS epidemic survey in Kenya) and with about 1.6 million people living with HIV infection. It is one of the six HIV high burden countries in Africa. The western part of the country through Homa bay, Siaya, Kisumu and Migori are the most affected with HIV rates of 25%, 23%, 19.3% and 14.7% respectively. Despite all the interventions put to address the issue it still remains a challenge. In Kenya in 2018 the percentage HIV prevalence of people living with HIV among adults 15 to 49 years was 4.7%, there has been progress in the number of AIDS related deaths since 2010 however death rates are highest across sub Sahara Africa, the world is making progress, over the past decade the number of global deaths has halved. The HIV epidemic had a major impact on life expectancy across sub Sahara Africa and life expectancy is only now back to pre-epidemic levels. Antiretroviral treatment has been key to preventing deaths from AIDS. It is estimated that it now averts 1.2 million deaths per year.

INTRODUCTION

The seventh edition of AIDS in Kenya reports an HIV prevalence rate of 8% in adult women and 4% in adult men. Populations in Kenya that are especially at risk are injecting drug users and people in prostitution, whose prevalence rates are estimated at 53% and 27% respectively. Kenya is one of the countries worst affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic. Data from the National AIDS Control Council indicate that by December 2000, about 2.2 million people in Kenya were living with HIV/AIDS and 13.5% of all adults were infected with HIV. (National Aids Control Council - NACC, 2001). Currently it has reduced to 1.6 million people living with HIV/AIDS.

ST CAMILLUS MISSION HOSPITAL

The facility is located in Migori County along the lake region in Nyatike Sub County and in Karungu Division. It implements HIV prevention strategies i.e. VCT, PITC, PMTCT, OPD/IPD, DTC and PNS (partner notification services).

STAFFING

The facility has six testers working around the clock in offering HIV services to the clients.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Nearly all the team went for internal and external capacity building i.e. counselors support supervision and electronic learning on monitoring and evaluation tools.
